

Development constraints

Development impediments in developing countries:

There should be cooperation between the government and members of society to achieve development with the aim of improving all the social, economic and also cultural conditions in society. Therefore, there is a disparity in the ability to achieve development. Developed countries have become as they are by achieving development in the best way, while in developing countries There are still obstacles that limit their access to the desired development, which made them lagging countries in many areas, and these obstacles as follows:

Social Constraints:

- The culture of shame, which is the dislike of society for some jobs such as carpentry, blacksmithing, agriculture and hygiene, where the individual is ashamed to work these jobs for fear of the society's sarcastic view of him.
- Ignorance and lack of information among many members of society.
- The existence of some negative customs and traditions such as lack of respect for the law in a lot of social problems, and stand in the face of girls who want to complete their university education in particular.
- The increase in the number of births in the so-called population explosion , and in contrast the few deaths.
- Individuals do not take care of their health.
- Social instability such as divorce, and family problems in their forms.
